To consider the CPI Cap rule for UG students registering for PG courses.

The Convener UGAPEC observed that UG students irrespective of their CPI, have been registering for PG courses with instructors; permission against the following provision of UG rule book :

4.7 Registration for Postgraduate level courses (EXISTING)

B.Tech. students belonging to category I and II with a CPI > 6.5 may be permitted to register for some postgraduate level courses as credit/ audit course from fifth semester onwards, if they are specifically offered to them. Prior permission of the Instructor concerned is required for registration for these courses. However, no relaxation in the CPI criterion is allowed.

The Convener, UGAPEC presented the proposal to UGPC. The committee deliberated on the proposal and recommended to revise sec. 4.7 as follows:

4.7 Registration for Postgraduate level courses (PROPOSED)

B.Tech. students may be permitted to register for some postgraduate level courses from fifth semester onwards with permission of instructor and approval of Faculty Advisor.

The UGPC- 2018-3 held on 18th September 2018 recommended the proposal to the Senate.
